Evacuation Alert

Due to the risk of fire, the Lytton First Nation are urging residents and visitors within the areas listed below to be prepared to evacuate if ordered to do so by emergency officials.

The Evacuation Alert is in effect for the following Indian Reserves:

Nkaih 10, Yawaucht 11, Tsaukan 12, Cameron Bar 13, Lytton 13A, Lytton 4F, Lytton 33, Lytton 4E, Lytton 4D, Lytton 4C, Lytton 4B, Lytton 4A, Nicklepalm 4, Seah 5, and Lytton 5A

What you should do when an evacuation alert is in effect:

- Be prepared to be issued an evacuation order.
- Locating all family members or co-workers and designating a safe meeting place in the event that an evacuation order is called.
- Gathering essential items such as medications, eyeglasses, valuable papers (i.e. insurance), immediate care needs for dependants and keepsakes. Have these items gathered and together in one place for a quick departure.
- Consider moving any disabled persons and/or children to a safe area.
- Moving pets and livestock to a safe area.
- Arranging transport for your household members or co-workers in the event of an evacuation order.
- Arranging accommodation for your family if possible. In the event of an evacuation, emergency accommodations will be provided if required.
- Monitoring news outlets for information on the locations of reception centres and the status of evacuation orders.

If you have to evacuate:

- Take an emergency survival / grab and go kit with you.
- Make sure you take prescription medicines and identification for the entire family.
- Listen to the radio and follow instructions from local emergency officials.
- Of you are instructed to do so, shut off water, gas and electricity.
- Make arrangements for your pets. Local emergency officials will advise you.
- Wear cloths and shoes appropriate for the conditions.
- Shut your windows and lock your home.
- Follow the routes specified by emergency officials. Don't take shortcuts. A shortcut could take you to a blocked or dangerous area.
- If you have time, contact others family members letting them know when you left and where you went.
- If you are evacuated, register with the local ESS emergency reception center closest to you.

EVERY ATTEMPT WILL BE MADE TO PROVIDE AS MUCH ADVANCE NOTICE AS POSSIBLE SHOULD AN EVACATION BE REQUIRED. CHANGING WEATHER CONDITIONS HOWEVER MAY RESULT IN LITTLE OR NO NOTICE.

This evacuation alert will remain in force until further notice, unless cancelled by order of the Lytton First Nation.
