



EVACUATION ALERT

Nadleh Whut'en First Nation

07/11/2023 – 22:00 hrs

An Evacuation Alert has been issued by **Nadleh Whut'en First Nation at the Emergency Operations Centre (EOC).**
Nithi Mountain Wildfire # G41422

Because of the potential danger to life and health, the Nadleh Whut'en First Nation has issued an **Evacuation Alert** for the following areas:

All populated Nadleh Whut'en First Nation Reserves, Particularly IR #1 and Lejac

An Evacuation Alert has been issued to prepare you to evacuate your premises or property should it be found necessary. Residents will be given as much advance notice as possible prior to evacuation; however, you may receive limited notice due to changing conditions.

This Evacuation Alert affects Nadleh Whut'en IR # 1 subdivisions and Lejac reserve. IR # 1 is located on Nautley Road, near Beaumont Provincial Park and Lejac is located along Highway 16 near Fraser Lake BC

WHAT YOU SHOULD DO:

- Locate all family members and designate a meeting area outside the evacuation area, should an Evacuation Order be called while separated.
- Pack essential items such as government-issued ID, medications, eyeglasses, valuable papers (e.g. insurance, credit, and mortgage information), immediate care needs for dependents and, if time and space permits, keepsakes for quick departure.
- Prepare to move disabled persons, children and/or neighbours, if assistance is needed.
- Prepare to take pets with you and move livestock to a safe area (if possible).
- Arrange transportation for all your household members. Fill the gas tanks of personal vehicles. If transportation assistance is needed, call Mr. Lucas Bhatoa @ (250) 570-7019.
- Arrange accommodation for all members of the residence, if possible.
- Wait for an Evacuation Order to be issued before evacuating. Monitor Nadleh Whut'en Webpage for information on evacuation orders and location of Reception Centres.
