



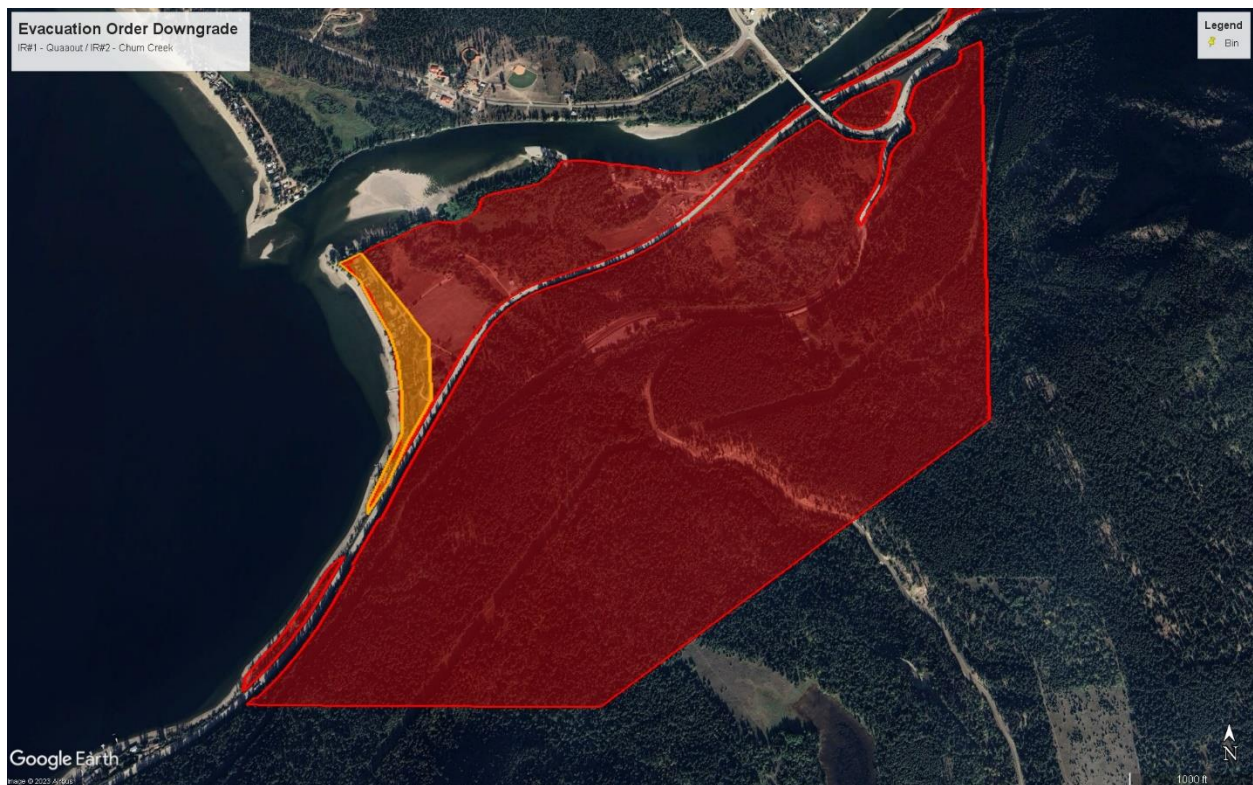
## PARTIAL EVACUATION RESCIND

**IR#2 – CHUM CREEK**  
(09/07/2023) AND TIME (10:00)

The Evacuation ORDER, pursuant to the Authority of the Council under Sections 81 and 88 of the Indian Act issued at **08/18/2023, 14:00** to the area(s) Skwłāx te Secwepemcúłecw IR#1 – QUAABOUT area has **PARTIALLY** been rescinded.

Partial areas of IR#2 – CHUM CREEK

SILVERY BEACH ROAD



(yellow are the areas rescinded/ red is still under ORDER)

An Evacuation ORDER may need to be reissued; however, if that is deemed necessary, the Evacuation Alert process will re-commence.



## WHAT YOU SHOULD KNOW:

- Other than the areas listed above, the rest of IR#1 – Quaaout is still under an Evacuation ORDER and is only accessible to responders. We ask that people only access their own properties and the main road.
- Valid ID will be required for access past the security check point at the Squilax-Anglemont Rd and Little Shuswap Lake Rd intersection.
- No guests are permitted into the area until the Evacuation Order has been rescinded for the whole area. Insurance brokers will need to be escorted by the property leaser or reach out or email [astelter@lslb.ca](mailto:astelter@lslb.ca) to have their name and information added to the access list.
- The Lands Department is currently working on an information package that should be available in the upcoming days with details for rebuilds, disposal of debris, and archeology requirements.
- The transfer station was damaged during the fire, and we are in the process of getting services back, but at this time people will need to utilize other transfer stations in the area for the time being.
- There will be roaming security in the area during the evenings that is provided by ALIB Security.
- Power has been restored along the main line, but Telus and Mascon services have not yet been restored.

## WHAT YOU SHOULD DO:

- Fill the gas tank of personal vehicles
- Bring a minimum of three days of food and essential supplies (e.g. medications, pet supplies) with you as local grocery stores may not yet have adequate stock
- Discard food and items exposed to heat, ash, chemicals, soot, water and smoke. Also discard fridges and freezer that held contaminated food.
