DO HEREBY RESOLVE THAT A quorum (3) of Whispering Pines/Clinton Indian Band Chief and Council met on July 24, 2026.

AND THAT Whispering Pines/Clinton Indian Band, on behalf of itself and its members, is represented by Chief and Council.

WHEREAS Pursuant to the Indian Act and their inherent powers of self-government, the Chief and Council is empowered to act on behalf of the Whispering Pines/Clinton Indian Band.

AND WHEREAS an Evacuation Order Expansion (Order No. JO-076) was made by the Thompson-Nicola Regional District on July 24, 2026 at approximately 11:00AM.

WHEREAS Whispering Pines Clinton Indian Band recognizes that the Province of British Columbia does not hold jurisdiction over WPCIB reserve lands, and further does not hold authority to implement evacuation orders over WPCIB Reserve lands, including the following; Clinton Reserve IR #1 adjacent to the town of Clinton, Reserve #3 near the Fraser River, Reserves #5 and #6 on Carson Street within the Village of Clinton Boundary.

THEREFORE be it resolved that Whispering Pines Clinton/ Indian Band issues the following evacuation order under their authority as the governing body for the following Whispering Pines Clinton Indian Band Indian Reserves # 1, 3, 5, and 6 in alignment with the current evacuation order implemented by the Thompson-Nicola Regional District and identified by the attached map and TNRD evacuation order expansion (JO- 076).

EVACUATION ORDER EXPANSION

Pear Lake Wildfire

July 24, 2026 at 1100 hours

WHEREAS a State of Local Emergency was declared on July 16, 2026 pursuant to Section 95 of the *Emergency and Disaster Management Act* due to wildfire within the jurisdiction of the Thompson-Nicola Regional District in Electoral Area "E" (Bonaparte Plateau);

AND WHEREAS an Evacuation Order Expansion (Order No. JO-074) was made by the Thompson-Nicola Regional District pursuant to Section 107 (1) (c) and (d) of the *Emergency and Disaster Management Act*, effective July 23, 2026 at 2300 hours for due to the Pear Lake Wildfire;

AND WHEREAS the area threatened by Pear Lake Wildfire has expanded;

The Evacuation Order Expansion (JO-074) is repealed and hereby **replaced** by this Evacuation Order, effective as of July 24, 2026 at 1100 hours. This Evacuation Order is now in place for approximately **119** addressed properties in Electoral Area "E" (Bonaparte Plateau).

If you are in the described area, **you must leave immediately**. A person must not enter the Evacuation Order area for purposes of residing, occupying, or visiting the area.

What You Should Do:

- To receive Emergency Support Services (ESS), please self-register through one of the following methods:
 - use the Evacuee Registration & Assistance tool: ess.gov.bc.ca; or
 - report to the ESS Reception Centre, located at 1655 Island Pkwy, Kamloops
 - if you need assistance refer to the Provincial ESS website (<https://ess.gov.bc.ca/>) and hotline (1-800-387-4258)
- Take critical items (medicine, purse, wallet, keys) if they are immediately available. Take your grab-and-go bag if you have one prepared.
- Transport pets in kennels or on a leash.
- Close gate latches, but do not lock gates.
- Power is often lost in evacuation areas; consider how to manage perishable foods and appliances within your home.
- Do not turn off your natural gas. FortisBC will turn off natural gas service as needed.
- Gather your family and, if you have room, take a neighbour or someone needing transportation. Do not use more vehicles than you need to.
- If you require transportation assistance from the area, advise the person providing this emergency notice, or call the TNRD at: 250-377-7188.
- Plan where you will stay. Make arrangements with family or friends; accommodation may be limited to cots in comingled shelters during emergencies.
