EVACUATION ORDER EXPANSION

Fiftynine Creek Wildfire

July 25, 2026, 1200 hrs

WHEREAS a declaration of a State of Local Emergency was made on July 16, 2026 pursuant to Section 95 of the *Emergency and Disaster Management Act* due to the Fiftynine Creek wildfire within the jurisdiction of the Thompson-Nicola Regional District in Electoral Area "E" (Bonaparte Plateau);

AND WHEREAS an Evacuation Order (Order No. JO-078) was made by the Thompson-Nicola Regional District pursuant to Section 107(1)(c) of the *Emergency and Disaster Management Act*, effective July 24, 2026 at 1730 hrs;

AND WHEREAS the area threatened by Fiftynine Creek Wildfire has expanded;

The Evacuation Order (JO-078) is repealed and hereby **replaced** by this amended Evacuation Order, effective as of July 25, 2026 at 1200 hrs. This Evacuation Order is now in place for approximately 299 addressed properties in Electoral Area "E" (Bonaparte Plateau).

Impacted expanded areas are as follows (19 addressed properties):

- **1537 to 1912 Chasm Rd;**
- **1160 to 1848 Hwy 97;**
- **2504 River Lakes FSR and**
- **Any other properties as outlined in the attached map.**

- properties south of Beaverdam Road addressed as follows:

 - 1085 to 1140 Big Bar Rd;
 - 1140 and 1260 Hooke Rd;
 - All properties around Beaverdam Lake
- All properties south of Meadow Lake FSR;
- All properties east of Poison Lake Rd;
- All properties surrounding Little Big Bar Lake; and
- any other properties as outlined in the attached map

If you are in the described area, **you must leave immediately**. A person must not enter the Evacuation Order area for purposes of residing, occupying, or visiting the area.

What You Should Do:

- To receive Emergency Support Services (ESS), please self-register through one of the following methods:
 - use the Evacuee Registration & Assistance tool: ess.gov.bc.ca; or
 - report to one of the following ESS Reception Centres below:

 - If you need assistance refer to the Provincial ESS website (<https://ess.gov.bc.ca/>) and hotline (1-800-387-4258).
- Take critical items (medicine, purse, wallet, keys) only if they are immediately available. Take your grab-and-go bag if you have one prepared.
- Transport pets in kennels or on a leash.
- Close gate latches, but do not lock gates.

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- Power is often lost in evacuation areas; consider how to manage perishable foods and appliances within your home.
- Do not turn off your natural gas. FortisBC will turn off natural gas service as needed.
- Gather your family and, if you have room, take a neighbour or someone needing transportation. Do not use more vehicles than you need to.
- If you require transportation assistance from the area, advise the person providing this emergency notice, or call the TNRD at: 250-377-7188.
- Make arrangements to stay with family or friends; accommodation may be limited during emergencies.
- If you require public aid assistance with lodging, food, or essentials, make sure you have a BCeID digital ID set up, then create or update your BC Emergency Support Services profile at ess.gov.bc.ca.
- To contact the Provincial ESS, call: 1-800-387-4258.
- To ensure you are getting timely emergency updates, register to Voyent Alert: tnrd.ca/voyent.

Emergency Support Services will only be provided if your primary residence is under evacuation order.

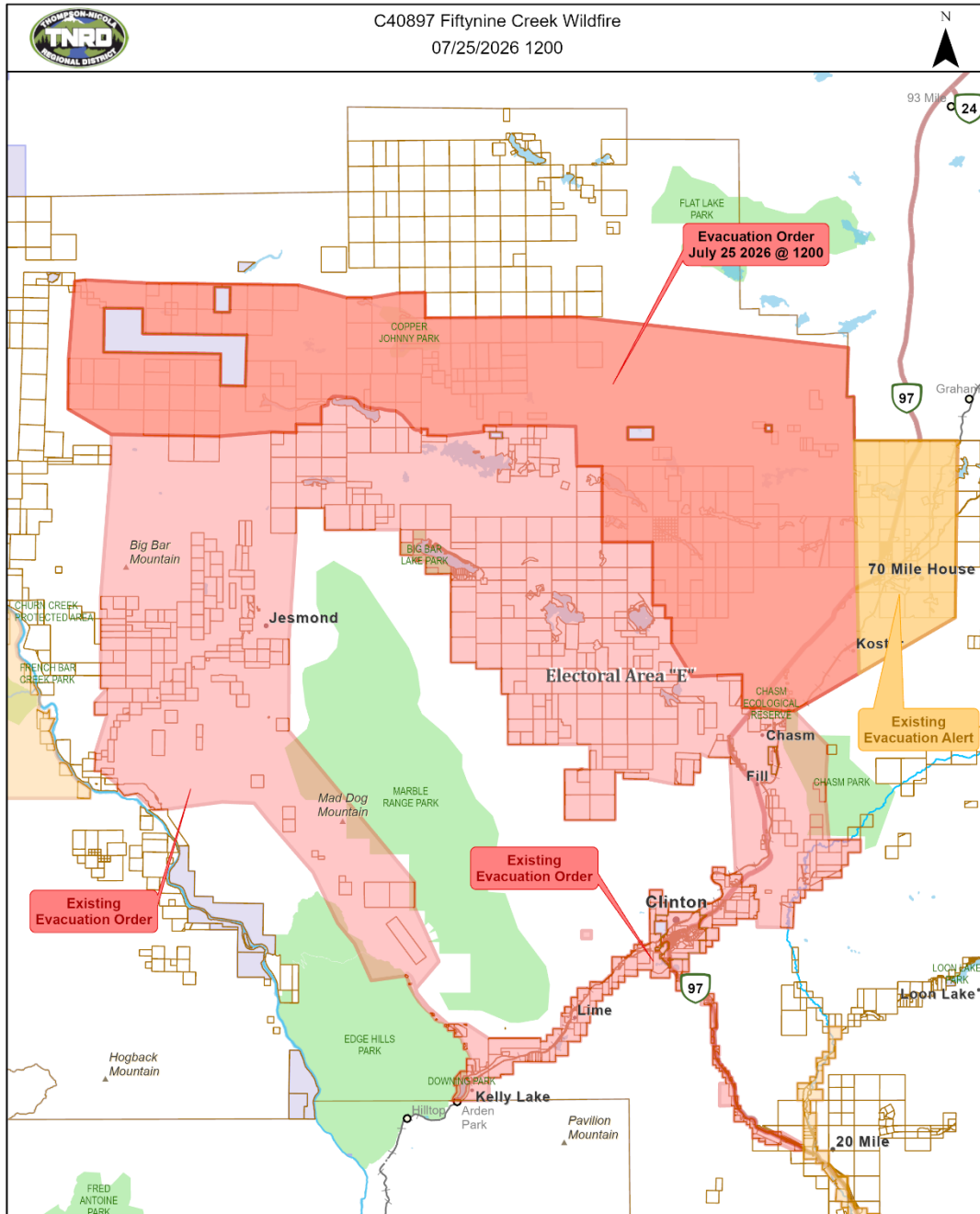


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
