Evacuation ALERT Nooaitch First Nations IT #10

July 8, 2026, at PM to remain in force for five days until July 13, 2026, at PM.

Unless cancelled by order of the Nooaitch Indian Band.

Due to the fire of Brunswick Creek Fire V10742, the Nooaitch Indian Band Chief & Council are urging residents & visitors within the area described as Nooaitch Indian Band to be prepared to evacuate if ordered to do so by emergency officials.

WHAT YOU SHOULD DO WHEN AN EVACUATION ALERT IS IN EFFECT
You should be prepared for the evacuation order by:

- Locating all family members or co-workers and designate a safe meeting place in the event that an evacuation order is called.
- Gathering essential items such as medications, eyeglasses, valuable papers (i.e., insurance), immediate care needs for dependent and, if you choose, keepsakes (photographs, etc.) Have these items readily available for a quick departure.
- Consider moving any disabled persons and/or children to a safe area.
- Moving pets and livestock to as a safe area.
- Arranging to transport your household members or co-workers in the event of an evacuation order.
- Arranging accommodation for your family if possible. In the event of an evacuation, emergency accommodation will be provided if required.
- Monitor news outlets for information on location of Reception Centre's and status of evacuation orders.

IF YO HAVE TO EVACUATE

- Take an emergency survival kit with you.
- Make sure you take prescription medicine and identification for the entire family.
- Listen to the radio and follow instructions from local emergency officials.
- If you are instructed to do so, shut off water, gas and electricity.
- Make arrangements for your pets. Local emergency officials will advise you.
- Wear clothes and shoes appropriate for the conditions.
- Lock your home.
- Follow the routes specified by emergency officials. Done take shortcuts. As shortcut could take you to a block or dangerous area.
- If you have time turn off all outside water sprinklers so water is conserved for firefighting efforts.
- If you are evacuated, register with the local ESS Emergency Reception Centre located at the ESS (address) _____ so you can be contacted or reunited with your family and loved ones.
